MHS names school track in honor of Coach Terry Lakes

Alumni turned out for special surprise ceremony at stadium



Longtime coach and teacher Terry Lakes stands with a crowd of family, friends, current student-athletes, and alumni who used to run for him, behind a plaque designating the Terry Lakes Track and Field Facility at the Marion High School sports complex.

In the fall of 2018, the Marion High School Athletic Department, Marion Community Schools administrators and School Board, and family and friends of longtime Marion High School coach and teacher Terry Lakes, took on a project: To keep Coach Lakes in the dark as long as possible about a special honor for him.

That project was, perhaps to the surprise of all, a success, because it wasn't until Sept. 14, 2018, that Coach Lakes learned of the effort.

It was on that evening, before

the Marion Giants Homecoming football game — which just happened to be against Coach Lakes' hometown of Richmond — that the school announced the newly named Terry Lakes Track and Field Facility.

Many alumni who had been on Coach Lakes' teams over the years turned out for the celebration. Coach Lakes said seeing so many former studend-athletes turn out in his honor was an emotional experience for him

"When I saw that group of guys coming down the track

I was floored," Coach Lakes told the Chronicle-Tribune for a report on the ceremony and honor.

1998 MHS alumnus Paige Brunner, who ran for Coach Lakes and now coaches runners at a neighboring school district, Oak Hill, had this to say to the C-T:

"I think that's profound, when you're a coach and make an impact on so many people you don't even realize. He'll always be Coach. No matter how old he is, how old I am, or how long we coach against each other.

It's special, and it's beyond well deserved."

Coach Lakes will continue to teach at Marion High School, where he is the chair of the English department and teacher for many of the Advanced Placement and dual credit classes that provide early college opportunities for MHS students.



"What a wonderful, thoughtful gift by one of our alumni," Fauser said.

Fauser reached out to Bobbie Owensby, MHS teacher and longtime community leader.

"Mrs. Owensby is one of our premier leaders and a fantastic teacher who always goes above and beyond to give our kids exciting new experiences," he said.

Owensby generously agreed to help with the trip, and identified two excellent Marion High School students who would enjoy and benefit from the trip: Azira Fisher and Leilanu Jackson, who both have exceptional GPAs (as of January 2019, 4.8340 and 4.9655, respectively), and who are great leaders and very active at MHS.

a car supplied by Matthews Buick to take a private tour at the Lake Orion, Mich., plant, getting an insider look at technology few get to witness directly, not to mention spend the day with a high level executive who was happy to share her insights and experience and encourage these Giants to reach for their dreams.

Boler Davis began her career with GM as a manufacturing engineer in Warren, Mich., and worked her way up to become the first African-American woman to be a plant manager at a GM vehicle manufacturing plant, leading the facility at Arlington Assembly in Texas. She went on to lead other facilities and then moved into the company vice president level, first overseeing customer experience, and then taking on global quality. She was named to her current role as executive vice president of global manufacturing in June 2018, a member of GM's senior leadership team.

Nine alums honored as MHS Hall of Distinction inductees

A crowd of friends, family members, and community members gathered on Marion High School's Homecoming Weekend to celebrate the 2018 class of inductees to the MHS Hall of Distinction.

The induction banquet is a highlight of the year and is always an inspirational event. This year was no exception.

The Hall of Distinction banquet is part reunion, part celebration, part inspiration. Attendees walk away remembering all the fantastic things about their time at Marion High School, and looking toward a bright future.

The nine 2018 inductees were:

- Earl E. Green, Marion High School Class of 1940, the first African-American postmaster in Grant County (inducted posthumously)

- Carlton Rose, Marion High School Class of 1980, President of Global Fleet Maintenance and Engineering for UPS
- Brian Balsbaugh, Marion High School Class of 1991, a leader in the sports and gaming industry, representing some of the most high-profile athletes and players in the world
- Kathleen L. Keller, Ph.D., Marion High School Class of 1991, award-winning researcher in the field of childhood eating behavior and obesity
- Scott and Julie Moorehead, Marion High School Class of 1996 and 1998, Scott is CEO of TCC, and co-founder the Culture of Good organization, which teaches businesses the im-

Culleys' gifts help grow endowments




